HOW TO IDENTIFY FUNDING FRAUD

We are aware of local charities which have been approached by fraudsters purporting to represent well-known grant funders, sending scam emails asking the recipient to transfer money to release a donation. Reputable funders would never ask you to transfer money to them in exchange for a donation. Make sure you undertake due diligence on unsolicited funding offers that could present a risk: you may find it helpful to refer to the Charity Commissions' Know your donor toolkit and to the NCSC Small Charity Guide.

Dream Trust Postcode Recovery Fund has been created to help charities develop solutions that address the issues affecting communities recovering from the pandemic. Registered charities can apply for up to £1,000,000 for projects which are able to show a clear link to the impact of COVID-19 on one or more of the Fund's priority areas (educational inequalities, homelessness, domestic violence, health and wellbeing, social exclusion and isolation, poverty). The deadline for applications is 30th October 2020; for more information, visit Postcode Dream Trust. Funding to help museums, galleries and cultural organisations:

Respond and Reimagine grants of between £10,000 to £50,000 are


